



Portable Assisted Study Sequence

Self-contained, semi-independent-study courses

Alternative means of earning credits

Supplemental support for skill-building, remediation, pre-teaching, test preparation, etc.

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High school Equivalency Program

The High School Equivalency Program is a statewide program that will provide students with the tutoring, support and preparation needed to take and pass the TASC, thus opening the door to better employment and greater opportunities.

You are eligible for HEP if you meet all of the following:

You're at least 16 years old and not enrolled in school.

You do not have a High School Diploma

You or an immediate family member has worked a minimum of 75 days in agriculture within the past 24 months.

We have agreements with many schools, as well as civic institutions, to provide these services especially at parent meetings etc.









ACCESS TO POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION AND FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Goal: To assure that when migrant students graduate from high school, they are academically prepared to succeed in, have been admitted to, and know how they will fund at least the first year of their postsecondary education.



QUALIFYING WORK

Agricultural or fishing work that lasts less than 12 months

Dealing with raw agricultural products: picking, packing, planting, harvesting, raising, or processing fruits, vegetables, or meats/animals
